Project History



The goal of this project is to propose a vision for the adaptive reuse of the site, integrating new architectural interventions while maintaining the integrity of its historical fabric.


The project draws inspiration from both the region's rich history and modern conservation practices, offering a sustainable future for the fortress as a vibrant public space and cultural hub.

PHOTOGRAMMETRY


Photogrammetry is a powerful technique used to create accurate 3D models from photographs. For the Kalaja Fortress project, photogrammetry was employed to capture the fortress's complex structures and topography. By taking multiple photographs from different angles, high-resolution 3D models of the fortress were generated, allowing for detailed analysis and documentation of its current state. This method ensures a precise digital representation of the site, which is essential for restoration planning, architectural analysis, and future interventions.

Additionally, the 3D model serves as a valuable tool for visualizing the integration of new architectural elements while preserving the historical integrity of the fortress.





ORTHOGRAPHIC VIEW OF THE FORTRESS






ELEVATIONS OF THE FORTRESS



MUSEUM

This proposal outlines the plan to repurpose the currently non-functional museum within Kalaja Fortress, Prizren. The space will be divided into two distinct areas: a restaurant/ bar/cafe and an exhibition space. This transformation aims to create a dynamic environment that caters to both social and cultural needs, enhancing the overall visitor experience at the fortress.



THE MOSQUE

This proposal outlines the renovation plan for the mosque, which aims to modernize its architecture while preserving its historical essence. The renovation will be based on the existing old stone foundation, incorporating contemporary elements such as a steel structure, glass slabs, and a double-layered façade featuring a mashrabiya pattern. This blend of traditional and modern architectural styles will create a unique and aesthetically pleasing environment for worshippers.

OPEN AUDITORIUM

This proposal aims to introduce a new stage at the existing open auditorium within the historic Kalaja Fortress in Prizren. The stage will serve as a versatile platform for social and public events, enhancing the cultural and communal engagement within the fortress. The design will be sensitive to the historical significance of the site while providing modern amenities for a wide range of events.
