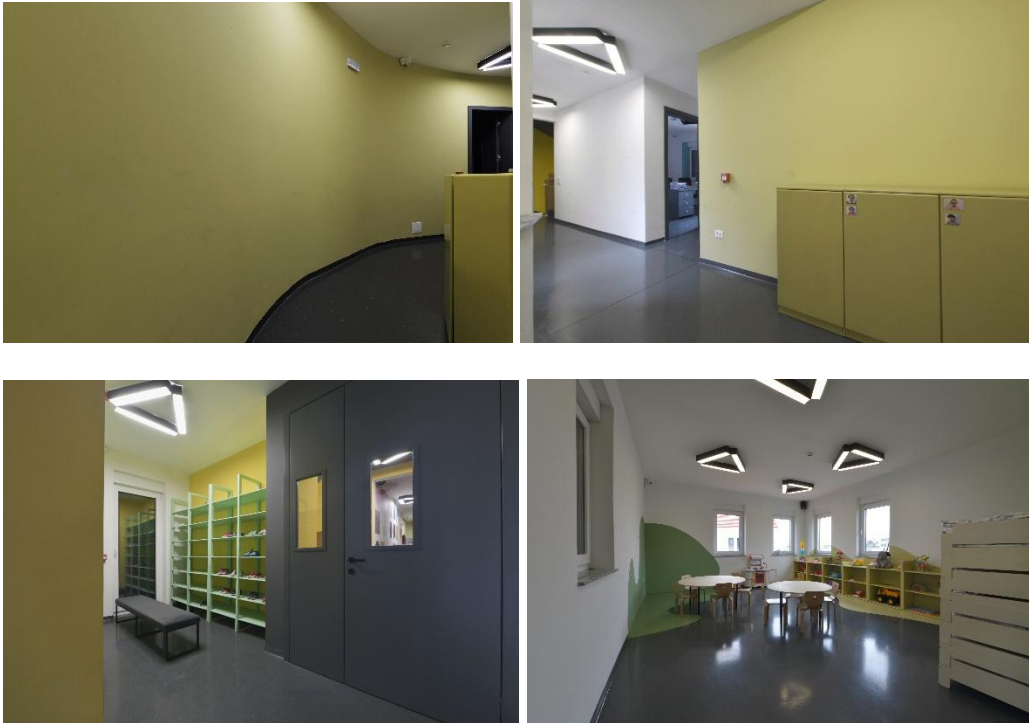
Architecture as a Neuroperspective Journey and Psycho-Physical Harmony

At the heart of every project lies human perception — not only what is seen, but the neuropsychological impact that space has on the individual.

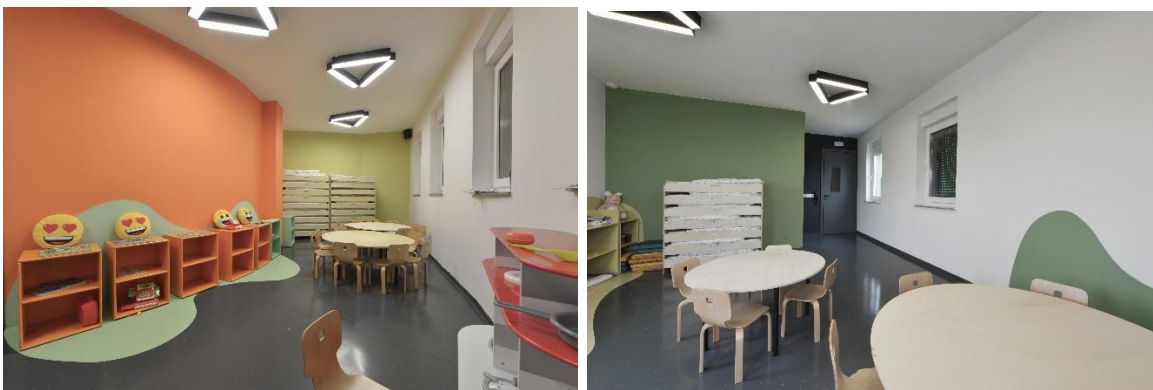
Especially in designing for children, I aim to craft environments that nurture brain development through chromatic harmony, spatial rhythm, and light.
