

The known characteristics are:








The building is located in 192 Ledra Street, Nicosia



The building's facade did not accurately portray its quality. The facade seemed rusted, and the original marble surfaces were unattractive due to a lack of maintenance

The building did not provide the safety and operational standards for commercial use, including fire safety regulations, emergency exits, and accessibility standards.

The building lacked new technical systems, resulting in disadvantages in operation. The lack of advanced energy technologies raised operation costs making the building unsustainable and environmentally unfriendly by today's standards and needs.

The building had many fundamental problems that made it unsuitable for general use. The mix of poorly constructed elements leads to a condition that look like Sick Building Syndrome, in which environmental circumstances had a negative impact on the user health. Plumbing pipes running through the façade were not only unattractive, but they also compromised the structure of the building and air quality.

The key element of the ground floor redesign, is the creation of a welcoming entrance, providing a professional reception and accommodating two new working stations.




