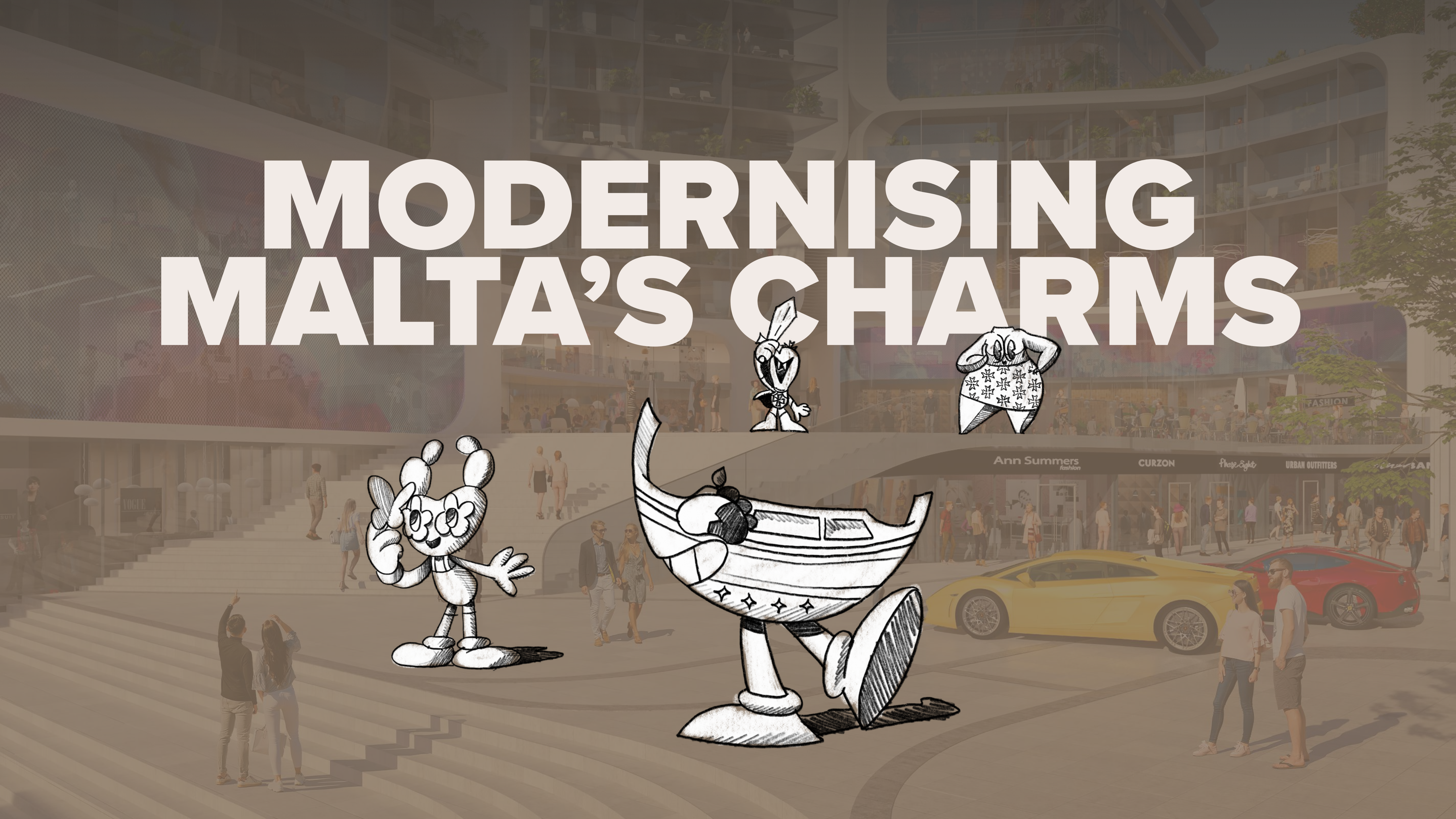

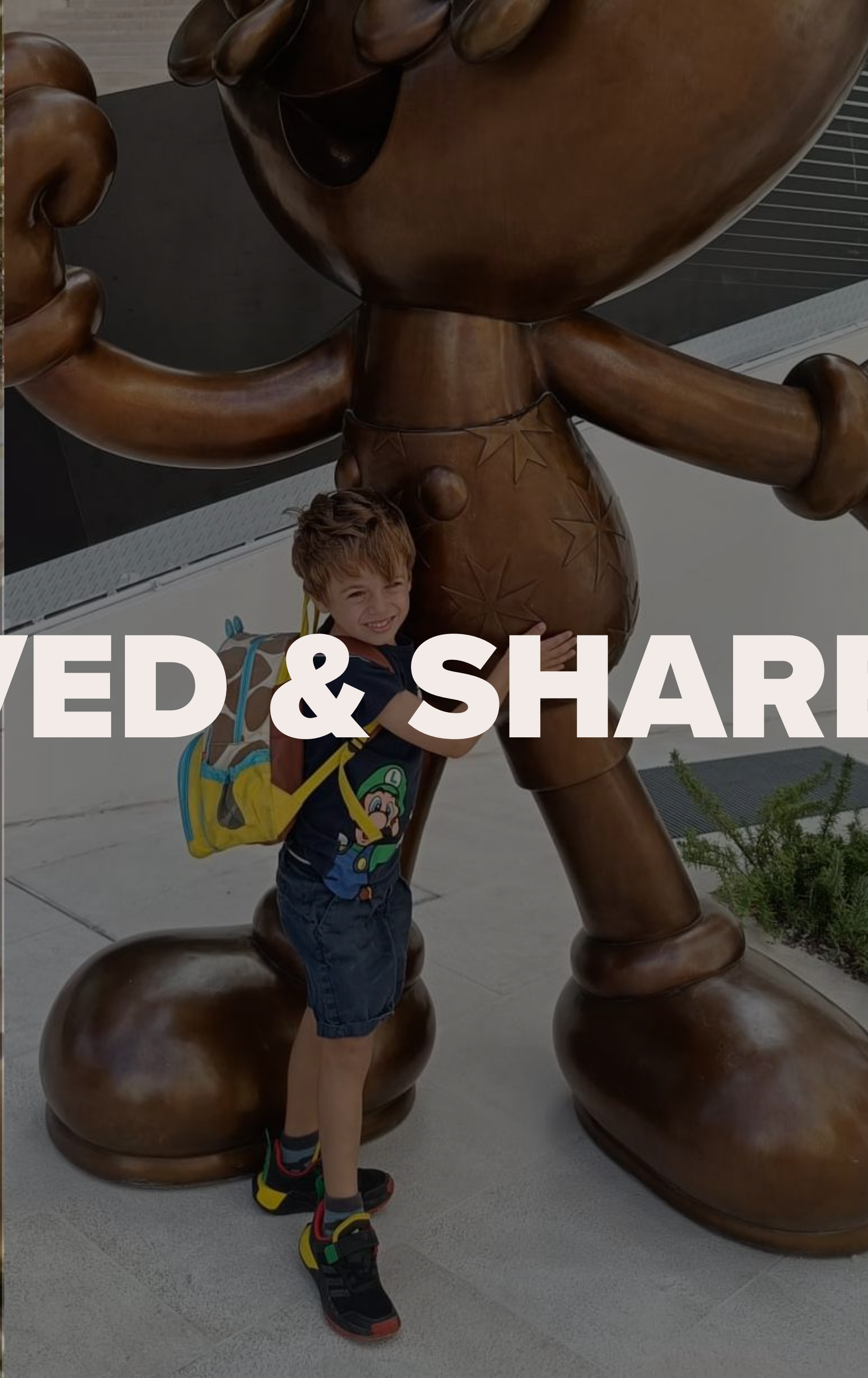
CULTURE HUMANISED

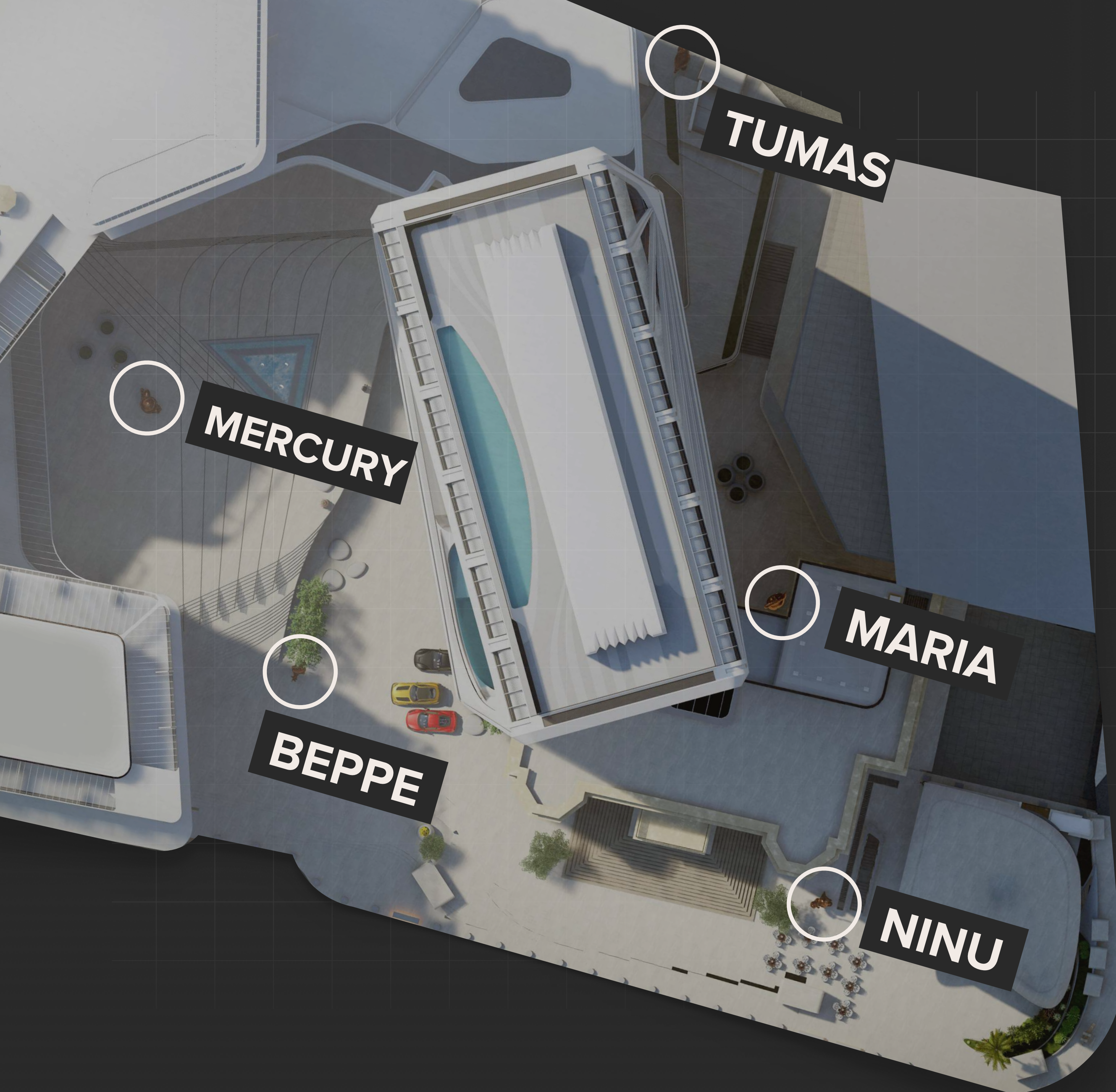

Malta has ancient history, layered culture, and a character all its own. What it was missing was a face. Archipals is a cast of five original characters, each one rooted in a different chapter of Maltese heritage and reimagined into something a child immediately recognises and an adult quietly loves. They live as permanent bronze sculptures, as merchandise, and as stories.

Built for families, tourists, and locals. Designed to make culture feel like something you want to be part of, not just read about. Each character carries a world behind them. Each one was made to be touched, photographed and remembered. The kids love them. That part wasn't an accident.



01 **Beppe The Cactus**

3m, 2024
Casted Bronze
Permanent Sculpture

Beppe is the prickly pear. Malta's most stubborn, most loveable landscape icon, humanised into a character. He stands a little awkward, a little proud, and entirely himself. One of the five Archipals, Beppe represents adaptability, resilience, and the quiet confidence of being different in a world that keeps asking you to fit in. His story, and sculpture have made him the most recognised of the five. Kids spot him first. Every time.



02 Tumas The Knight

3.6m, 2024
Casted Bronze
Permanent Sculpture

Tumas is the Knight. Small in stature, enormous in heart. He carries the spirit of the Knights Hospitaller of St. John, the order that gave Malta its iconic eight-pointed cross, its bastions, and its capital Valletta. One of the five Archipals, Tumas represents courage, loyalty, and the belief that bravery has nothing to do with size.



03 **Maria The Goddess**

3m, 2024
Casted Bronze
Permanent Sculpture

Maria reaches back further than any of them. Inspired by the ancient goddess of fertility found in Malta's prehistoric temples at Hagar Qim and Ggantija, she carries thousands of years of story in her form. One of the five Archipals, Maria represents inner beauty, self-confidence, and the quiet power of a culture that has always known its own worth. She is the one people stop at longest.



04 **Ninu The Luzzu**

3m, 2024
Casted Bronze
Permanent Sculpture

Ninu is the luzzu. The colourful fishing boats that hug Malta's coastline, each painted with the Eye of Osiris, a Phoenician symbol believed to ward off evil at sea. One of the five Archipals, Ninu carries that same watchful spirit. He represents resilience, protection, and the courage it takes to push past your fears and into open water.



05 Mercury

3m, 2024
Casted Bronze
Permanent Sculpture

Mercury is the one who brought them all together. The mascot for Mercury Properties, he stands as a symbol of the vision that gave the four Maltese Archipals a permanent home inside building. He represents what happens when a brand decides to invest in culture, not just real estate. Without him, the others don't exist.
